
Lechlade Art Society First Ever Pop Up Sale




Brusho



New medium to you?


When Rod Craig gave his demonstration last year, he used watercolour and then, to enhance the colours, he said he sometimes uses Brusho. Not everyone had come across this. I have used it over the years in schools but it does come with a warning. Brusho is a powdered pigment which can be mixed with water to create a colour wash ink. It is incredibly strong and the tiny grains of dye are very potent. They can migrate everywhere and can stain easily. Having given you a 'health warning' don't be put off as they are great fun and can be used by sprinkling a little colour on to either wet paper or on to dry paper and then spritzed with a fine spray. It is fascinating to watch the textures and colours develop. Black for instance is composed of all the colours which move at different speeds over the paper. The pigment comes in small tubs as in the image above. A great tip is to make a pin hole in the lids and then shake a tiny amount out. There are some great videos on YouTube. Search it out!
